The Village of Silver Lake Council met in a regular session on Monday, July 17, 2017, at Silver Lake Village Hall, 2961 Kent Road, Silver Lake, Ohio.

With President of Council Mr. Gerald Jones presiding, the meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m.

Proclamation to Dr. Ted Curtis

Dr. Ted Curtis, 2965 Silver Lake Boulevard, was signed in to speak about four car garages. Mayor Hovey said Dr. Curtis thinks he's here to speak about a garage, but we cannot let Dr. Curtis leave the Planning Commission without issuing a proclamation for his 19 years of service. Mayor Hovey read the proclamation and presented it to Dr. Curtis.

Dr. Curtis said he has enjoyed his time on the Planning Commission, serving once before he moved to Los Angeles and having the privilege to be asked to serve again when he moved back. He resigned because he spends six months in the winter in Phoenix, Arizona. This is a beautiful Village. It's not easy to keep a place up once you get up to the top. Then there's only one direction you can go; you slide downhill. In Silver Lake it's still there, and it's still going.

Dr. Curtis thanked Council and the Mayor for the proclamation.

Comments from the audience:

Mr. Jones advised residents they will have three minutes to speak. Mr. Jones said to make this easier to control, Mr. Housley will ring a bell when you have 15 seconds left, and ring again when your three minutes are up.

Kelley Tatro, 2993 Silverview, said I have been doing research for about three months regarding deer culling. I'm sure you have done due diligence as well. There's a lot of information showing that culling will have to continue. When you cull the herd, the females become more fertile and have twins and triplets to try to replenish the herd. There are lots of alternatives that don't necessitate killing the animals. Last Tuesday the EPA gave their thumbs up to a new drug for the management of deer populations in residential areas. I printed several copies if you would like to take a look at them. Studies over the last 30 years have shown that light to moderate hunting does not reduce the deer population over time in an otherwise stable environment. Deer produce more fawns since the food supply is increased for the remaining deer. Effects of urban hunting are short-

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term, at best. An additional complication is that per capita reproduction is density dependent, meaning the average number of fawns produced and reared by each doe increases as the population decreases. It costs \$200 to administer the drug, and it has to be administered again in six years. It keeps the females infertile. I grew up in this Village and came back after college. The deer were here first. If we've gotten to a place where we're killing animals because they are eating our hostas, what does that say about us? What are we going to say to our children and grandchildren?

Debb Gertz, 2936 Ivanhoe, said my concern is that it has been decided to kill the animals. Medina also has a large deer problem, and they have looked to other means. They will not be culling, and have asked residents to not feed them. They have used different approaches. We haven't had the population everyone thinks we have, as I've noticed I haven't seen any in months, and I used to see them every day. I'm concerned about how the Village is split. I feel safe here and I feel very fortunate for our Police Department. I'm sure you heard about a young kid shooting a deer with a BB gun, which could have hurt a citizen. If citizens are going to take matters into their own hands and make their own decisions, we have a much bigger problem than talking about culling animals. I'm concerned that other options are not being really considered - what is best for the Village; what is best for the people; and what is best for the animals. I don't understand why we are not voting. I think we should have a vote.

Vicky Marimon, 3027 Harriett, said (inaudible)...I used to have 10-12 deer in my yard daily. I have not seen a deer in I can't tell you when. I don't even spray the plants because there are no deer. It's been suggested to me you are taking things into your own hands. I certainly hope not.

Mr. Jones said we are not going to go there.

Mr. Church said I have a question.

Mr. Jones said no.

Mr. Church said yes, I do. Why do you suppose that's the case?

Mrs. Marimon said it's not that they're going away. We've lived here all these years and we've lived through summers and falls. What they're telling us is they are reproducing in the woods. I miss them. We loved standing on our patio while eating breakfast, and they are just not there anymore. (Inaudible).

FINANCE AND APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE – MR. CHRISTOPHER SCOTT**RESOLUTION NO.: 57-2017**

Mr. Scott asked if there were any questions. The amount is high because we did not have an earlier meeting in July, and this is a double Payment of Claims.

Mr. Scott asked about a payment for a 72-inch sweeper.

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Mr. Lipan said it is a broom and cleans dirt off the roads.

There being no further questions, Mr. Scott said this Resolution would be brought out for adoption this evening.

RESOLUTION NO.: 58-2017

Mr. Scott asked if there were any questions.

There being no questions or comments, Mr. Scott said this Resolution would be brought out for adoption this evening.

RESOLUTION NO.: 59-2017

Mr. Scott asked Mr. Housley to speak to this.

Mr. Housley said retail for this equipment is around \$21,000. The State bid price is about \$9,728. We got a quote for \$9,200, so it's under the State bid.

We pay about two cents per page on our current copier, which is about \$2,500 a year. This copier will cost half a cent per page, which will save us about \$2,000 per year. We will recover our investment in about three to four years. We have been having some problems with the old copier that we haven't been able to fix, so this is needed.

Mr. Church asked if there is a machine that is less expensive that would do the same things.

Mr. Housley said it wouldn't do what we need it to do.

Mr. Jones asked about the old copier.

Mr. Housley said it wasn't worth anything as a trade-in. We could try to sell it or see what we want to do with it.

There being no further questions or comments, Mr. Scott said this Resolution would be brought out for adoption this evening.

RESOLUTION NO.: 60-2017

Mr. Scott asked if there were any questions.

Chief Conley said the daily rate has gone up a little. The last bill was \$3,375. Macedonia works out very well for us, as all we have to do is drop the prisoner off. We don't have to do any paperwork. They automate their arraignments through a video feed, so we don't need to have an

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officer pick up the prisoner to take to the courthouse. The cost has increased from \$85 to \$95 per day, effective January 1, 2017. We don't have a lot of prisoners.

There being no further questions or comments, Mr. Scott said this Resolution would be brought out for adoption this evening.

RESOLUTION NO.: 61-2017

Mr. Scott asked Mr. Lipan to speak to this.

Mr. Lipan said the pump provides service to three homes. In 2010, it was \$14,926 to replace two pumps that were approximately 15 years old. This year we had to have the pump cleaned out, as there were things being put down the sewer that were not supposed to be flushed. A letter went out to the residents. One of the pumps burned up, as something was stuck in it. We do have one other pump working. We check it twice daily during the week, and also check it on weekends.

Mrs. Steiner asked if there is any responsibility for the homeowners involved.

Mr. Lipan said there are three homes and we can't prove who is flushing things.

Mr. Heydorn...(inaudible).

Mr. Lipan said between 2010 and 2012 we spent \$22,000 on it.

Mayor...(inaudible)

Mr. Heydorn said one of the three is causing this, and at some point we may have to make a decision to assess some of these costs. The question is how much we make taxpayers around the Village pay for something someone is doing that's illegal.

Mrs. Steiner asked how much time we should have gotten out of it.

Mr. Lipan said the last one was 15 years. We should have used it more than seven years.

Mrs. Steiner said if it does happen again I hope we don't swallow these costs.

Mr. Scott said this was an emergency situation.

Mr. Church asked if there was a way to determine which one of the three homes was doing this.

Mayor said he plans on having a meeting with each of the three households and letting them know the facts. Maybe they can put pressure on each other.

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Mr. Lipan said one option would be to put a grinder pump on each of the three homes.

Mr. Jones asked how much that would cost. It might be something to think about.

Mr. Heydorn...(inaudible)

Mrs. Fuller asked if they got notice from the Village regarding what is allowed to be flushed.

Mayor said Mr. Lipan has made sure they have received letters.

There being no further questions or comments, Mr. Scott said this Resolution would be brought out for adoption this evening.

RESOLUTION NO.: 62-2017

Mr. Scott asked if there were any questions.

Mr. Housley said we didn't appropriate for the grinder pump and it wasn't in the budget. That's why we need this Resolution.

RESOLUTION NO.: 63-2017

Mr. Scott asked if there were any questions.

Mr. Scott said the bid is a wonderful price, at \$130,000 less than the next bid.

Mr. Lipan said they know the area, and he is confident they will do a good job.

Mayor said this company has done good work for us. In the past, they have been awarded a project for the bid price and gave us money back, because they didn't have to spend all the money.

Mr. Jones asked how long the project will take.

Mr. Lipan said they have already started, and it should be two to three months.

Mrs. Steiner asked if the companies always see the estimated cost as shown on the bid sheet.

Mr. Lipan said yes, and that's usually around where they bid.

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There being no further questions or comments, Mr. Scott said this Resolution would be brought out for adoption this evening.

RESOLUTION NO.: 64-2017

Mr. Scott asked if there were any questions.

There being no questions or comments, Mr. Scott said this Resolution would be brought out for adoption this evening.

ORDINANCE NO.: 65-2017

Mr. Scott asked if there were any questions.

Mr. Housley said this is to supplement the Silver Lake Boulevard project.

Mayor said when we first talked about this months ago, I said I was in favor of spending some of our General Fund money. We should be able to spend \$500,000 or \$600,000 from the \$2,000,000 we had and still be financially solvent. That's what I suggested to Sean, and I'm sure I mentioned it before. I thought we could put a substantial amount of money down.

Mr. Scott said we are putting down \$23,000, which is 10 percent.

Mr. Housley said originally Silver Lake Boulevard and Lee Road were piggybacked together, for about \$500,000. He still intends to supplement the Lee Road project, which is a larger project, but we are waiting for the bids to come in. The estimate could be high.

Mr. Church asked how often we supplement a project.

Mr. Housley said over the years I don't believe it has been often. It's something that, collectively, you all agreed to do. The money is coming from the large inheritance tax settlement we got. Instead of putting it all in General Capital, we put it all in the General Fund, so we had some discretion on how to use those monies.

Mrs. Steiner said we haven't done it before because we haven't been able to.

Mr. Housley said we haven't had the resources.

There being no further questions or comments, Mr. Scott said this Ordinance would be brought out for adoption this evening.

ORDINANCE NO.: 66-2017

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Mr. Housley said we are increasing appropriations for these projects, which we didn't budget for, and reclassifying some appropriations. Also, we need appropriations for the copy machine.

There being no further questions or comments, Mr. Scott said this Ordinance would be brought out for adoption this evening.

STATEMENT OF CASH POSITION

Mr. Scott said the Statement of Cash Position of June 30, 2017, was presented.

Mr. Housley said everything is in line with where we should be mid-year. In our General Fund miscellaneous and other revenues, we just received a workers compensation premium rebate of \$13,000 that we weren't expecting, plus some other revenues. Therefore, we are coming in a little higher than I expected in the General Fund.

There being no further questions or comments, Mr. Scott said this Statement would be brought out for adoption this evening.

Reports of Village Officials

Mayor Hovey reported we received notice today the Cuyahoga Falls Fire Department did an inspection of our premises, and everything is up to code. It's good to know we're doing everything we can to prevent fires.

I was not able to attend the festival this weekend, as my wife and I were out of town for a wedding, but I understand it was a huge success. They ran out of food, which I think is a good thing, instead of having to give away what's left at the end. I saw Fred Johnson Thursday before I left. He said Mayor, as much as we are going to miss you, we are going to miss your wife a lot more. She does a lot of the cooking and the work for the festival.

You have two drafts of revised legislation to review over the next few weeks. One is a final revised draft regarding deer legislation, which is based on what Jeff Westerfield from the ODNR gave us. It was tweaked by Mr. Heydorn to suit Silver Lake. Refer any changes or comments you want to make on it, and I will do some research and get more information. We also want to put more teeth into the legislation we have about feeding the deer. That was requested by the opposition to deer culling. They say people are feeding the deer and nothing is happening. I think right now it's a minor misdemeanor, which is basically nothing. I asked Mr. Heydorn to write it up as a third degree misdemeanor, which carries a \$250 fine or 30 days in jail. A repeat offense would be \$500 and 60 days in jail. If you want to go that far, that's up to you, but that's the next step in the process.

It was also suggested the people opposed to deer culling put up deer crossing signs at the eastern and western borders of the Village on Graham Road and Kent Road, but I can't guarantee the deer will cross at those signs.

I cannot end without thanking Mrs. Fuller. You've been a great Council person for us. You served three terms, 12 years total, and you've been fun to work with. You've always had the interests of the Village at heart. Although we've disagreed on some things here and there, we've always had respect for each other, and we could always talk about our opinions. You did a very good job for us.

Mrs. Fuller thanked the Mayor, saying it has been an honor and a privilege. I am going to miss you all very much.

Mr. Robert Heydorn, Village Solicitor, said everything that was said covers what I could possibly say, but I would personally like to thank Mrs. Fuller for her service. In addition to her

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long service on Council, her family has been instrumental in keeping Crystal Lake alive for years and years. It's very important to keeping that facility part of Silver Lake. Her husband is a dedicated Rotarian and Mrs. Fuller has supported him in that activity all these years. Whether you know it or not, they did an awful lot for our community and communities in general in this area. They have been part of the community across the board, and I also, personally, say thank you.

Mrs. Fuller thanked Mr. Heydorn, adding I've worked with so many of you; Bob with Rotary, Bill with Crystal Lake, Bernie with coffee and donuts at Holy Family. Chief Conley and I go back a long time. We raised teenagers together. It's been a remarkable run here. Thank you.

Mr. Jones said regarding the house on Graham Road, I had asked Mr. Heydorn to look into writing an ordinance, as the penalty for the violation is not severe. Mr. Heydorn said he has been busy with the deer issue legislation, and Mr. Jones asked Mr. Heydorn to follow up on writing an ordinance when he finishes the deer issue.

Mr. Mark Lipan, Service Director, told Mrs. Fuller it was nice to work with her and wished her good luck.

Mr. Scott asked Mr. Lipan if he had any update on the Kent Road paving.

Mr. Lipan said he has emailed them, but has not received an answer.

Mr. Jones asked Mr. Lipan to make sure the dirt on Silver Lake Boulevard is cleaned up where they are working on the new home.

Mr. Scott asked what our policy is on temporarily putting mulch on the roadway.

Mayor said when we become aware of it, we tell them to remove it immediately.

Chief Conley said he sent an officer out to advise them to remove it.

Mr. Jones thanked Mr. Lipan for fixing the bump at intersection of Graham and Dover Roads and on South Dover Road.

Chief John Conley, had no report.

Mr. Sean Housley, Clerk-Treasurer, reported June is reconciled. For tax year 2015, we are still pursuing non-filers. There was originally between 220-300 non-filers. We issued some subpoenas in October and collected about \$14,000. We prepared internal subpoenas and the Police Department dropped them off. The non-filers were asked to come in at the end of June, and we collected another \$14,000 to \$18,000. There are just a handful now that we will give one more opportunity by certified mail. They will come in, hopefully, the first week in August. There are some non-residents on the list who live in Cuyahoga Falls, Stow, Akron, etc. Because we are still

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working on the 2015 program, we are a little behind on the 2016 program. We are scheduled to have the 2016 non-filers come into Village hall this November.

Mr. Lipan added we sold the old dump truck for \$15,000. The leaf equipment did not sell. We have lowered the price.

Miscellaneous Business

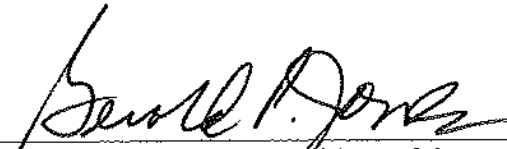
