Catch Basins

At the beginning of each month, Buckeye Street Sweeping sweeps all the streets in the Village. Between sweepings the catch basins may become clogged by grass clippings and other debris. If you notice this in front of your house, please do your part by clearing it. If you are not able to do this, please call the Service Department so we can clear it (330-923-5233).

Water Conservation

Repairing a dripping faucet saves water and money, since the repair can quickly pay for itself. Leaks can account for as much as 20 percent of an average household's water use. Even the smallest drip can add up to a significant loss of water and energy, if a hot water faucet is leaking. A leaking toilet can waste up to 200 gallons a day. You can detect a toilet leak by adding a few drops of food coloring to water in the tank. If colored water shows up in the bowl, without flushing, a leak is present.

Fall Leaf and Limb Pick-up



Monday October 31st through Sunday December 4th. Please keep leaves and limbs in separate piles and do not put them in the street. Limbs must be under 10 ft and no larger than 4 inches in diameter. Complete tree removal and items with root systems will **NOT** be collected.
