Summit Metro Parks offer a multitude of programs around the county on topics related to the interaction and interdependency of plants, animals, insects and humans in our environment. Visit their website for a complete listing https://www.summitmetroparks.org/.

- The 61st Annual Fall Hiking Spree runs September 1 November 30. Hike 8 of the designated trails to earn your hiking staff (1st year hikers) or annual shield (for returning hikers). This year's hiking spree theme is Honoring Indigenous Culture. Trailheads will post information about the indigenous peoples who are part of the history and landscape of the parks. - Stroll Along the Stream, Saturday, Sept 14, 11am 12pm.
 Hike 1.3 mile Rock Creek Trail with a naturalist and learn about stream-based ecosystems; Furnace Run/Brushwood area.
